Koinonia House welcomes you as our guest on this exciting tour of Israel! This will be a special time together because of the places, people, and new insights to be gained.

There will be professional Israeli guides with us, but we will also hear from Bob Cornuke and Ron Matsen, who have teamed up once again to help us better understand the places we will be visiting.



Robert (Bob) Cornuke has used his training with the FBI, his experience as a police investigator, along with important findings from historical sources and archaeology to demonstrate the accuracy and trustworthiness of the Bible.

Bob has participated in over sixty expeditions around the world searching for lost locations described in the Bible. As a result, he has appeared on National Geographic Channel, CBS, NBC's Dateline, Good Morning America, CNN, MSNBC, Fox, ABC, History Channel, and Ripley's Believe it Or Not.

The Temple, one of the nine books Bob has written, examines the possibility that Solomon's temple was located in the City of David, not on the Temple Mount.

This has stirred discussions among many groups; from academics and archaeologists to Israeli shop owners.

Ron Matsen is president of Koinonia House, and you have likely seen him in the *Personal Update* news journal, as well as in the *Body Builders* and *Forge* series on YouTube. You may even have met him at one of Koinonia Institute's Strategic Perspectives Conferences. Ron has also been the familiar face on the Q&A sessions he hosted with the late Dr. Chuck Missler, the founder of Koinonia House.

Ron has co-hosted tours in Israel with Chuck, as well as leading tours when he was the pastor of a church in the UK. He has over thirty years in the pastoral ministry, and has taught verse-by-verse through the Bible many times.



Ron brings a wealth of knowledge about this special land and it's history. This allows him to explain the fabric of biblical history as well as the practical and personal relevance of a particular site.

Our Guide



Ido Garfinkle has been a guide for over a

decade. He started when he was a student at Hebrew University of Jerusalem, where he studied Bible and geography. He speaks Hebrew, German, and English which helps him tap into many historical documents, both Christian and Jewish.

ARRIVAL DAY: Monday, 18 September

We will all land at Ben Gurion Airport (TLV) but at different times. The goal is to arrive at the <u>Vert Lagoon Hotel</u>, in Netanya (north of Tel Aviv) in time for dinner (buffet opens at 6:30 PM) and an 8:00 PM orientation.

Jet lag can be an issue for people crossing many time zones. The usual advice is to be well rested when you start your trip. Also, drink plenty of water and adjust your sleeping pattern right away. (Some people use a sleeping aid for their new bedtime.)

Most importantly, keep your focus on the Lord. Enter this land as His ambassador.

THREE NORTHERN NIGHTS

Tuesday– Thursday, 19-21 September

Our touring begins!* After breakfast, we will head north from Netanya and ultimately arrive at our base for three nights: **Sofia Hotel Tiberias**.

Most evenings, we will have some time with Ron Matsen and Bob Cornuke. They will conduct a Question & Answer session, or present a special briefing.

If you noticed it missing, you may be asking, "What about lunch?" We have breakfast and dinner buffets at the hotels, but not lunch. Three lunches are included with the tour package, and on the other days, there will be opportunities for you to buy lunch.



Water bottles are available for sale on the bus, usually for a dollar (a good price).

Weather in the northern regions will be cooler than Tel Aviv. Dressing with layers is a good idea so you can adjust easily throughout the day.

Transition: The Jordan Valley

We leave the Galilee and head south into the Jordan Valley. As we drive through this valley, we are traveling near the border of Israel and Jordan with it's fencing near the Jordan River.

Some of the sights we'll see include:

Beit She'an, an immense city ultimately ruined by an earthquake.

Tel Jericho, the city conquered by Israel when God made the walls fall down.

This will be the first day we visit a site within a "West Bank" administrative district. There are three districts established by the Oslo Accords: A, B, and C. Beit She'an is not in the "West Bank" but Jericho is in Area A: under Palestinian political and military control. We have found locals and shopkeepers to be very friendly to us as tourists because they appreciate the business we bring to them. To be prudent, we also monitor news reports and have registered with both Israeli and US governments to receive any alerts they issue about serious issues in the country.

From Jericho, we will climb above sea level and enter Jerusalem.

SEVEN JERUSALEM NIGHTS *including one day at the Dead Sea, another for Yom Kippur*

Friday, 22 September to Checkout on Friday, 28 September

Arriving from Jericho, we will settle into the hotel we'll use for the rest of the tour: The Leonardo Plaza Hotel, located near the Old City.

The itinerary for the coming week will include four different areas: the Dead Sea, the Old City, City of David, and Judea outside of Jerusalem.



Leonardo Plaza Hotel, Jerusalem

We will spend an entire day visiting sites in the Dead Sea area. That will mean traveling below sea level, again. In fact, we will be standing on the lowest dry land of the entire planet. While there, we will see places where God preserved His people and His word.

Another of the four areas is the Old City of Jerusalem. We will pause for the day of Yom Kippur to learn

about the Feasts of the Lord. Then we will walk on the Temple Mount, explore the various sectors of the city, and consider the things that happened within these walls.

Just downhill from the Old City is the City of David, the original City of Peace (Salem, or Shalom). It dates back to the days of Melchizedek. Centuries later, David, with his army, conquered this fortress from the Jebusites and made it his home and headquarters. Until modern times, no one knew this city was beneath the soil they were farming. We will see evidence, including some places not open to the general public, that shows this was the original Jerusalem, .

Along with those three areas, we will go into the surrounding land of Judea, to the south of Jerusalem.
